In the Curriculum

As part of our curriculum offer and commitment to supporting our children's mental health and wellbeing, all children in KS1 and KS2 are taking part in weekly wellbeing workshops. These workshops are being delivered by Fifth Movement. This week in class the children have concentrated on their breathing and have completed some meditation exercises. The children enjoyed their first session with coach Judith this week.



This week, we launched our 'Mystery Reader' project across the school. It was great to see visitors in school reading to our children. If you would like to be involved in the project speak to the class teacher. Remember, there are few things as powerful as regularly reading to a young child. It has astonishing benefits for children: comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. Giving a child time and full attention when reading them a story tells them they matter. It builds self-esteem, vocabulary, feeds imagination and even improves their sleeping patterns.

In Science, Y3 have been investigating forces and how a toy car travels on different surfaces. The children in Y3 planned their investigation to make it fair and then carried out their test.



Over the last week, the children in both the Infants and Juniors have been building on their understanding of one of the British Values – democracy. Mr Dalton has led assemblies in both departments and the children have been thinking about examples of democracy in our school. They have learnt about how different our Britain would be without democracy. Why not ask your child what democracy means and why it is so important in society?

Punctuality

Being on time for school is very important. It helps children to get into good habits for life.

School work starts as soon as a child enters the classroom. If your child is late, they have missed that work. It is unsettling for a child to enter the classroom late. It disrupts the teaching, so it impacts everyone. When late your child also misses the social aspect of greeting their teacher and peers.

Did you know, if your child arrives more than 10 minutes late, they lose their mark for the whole morning? This impacts greatly on your child's attendance figures.

As we are a split-site school we stagger start times and this allows enough time to move between buildings if you're doing a double drop off.

Infants

Gates open from 8.40am to 8.50am. Children who are late after 8.50am greatly impact the smooth running of the office, as Mrs Clancy has to leave her room to take children into school.

Juniors

Gates open at 8.45am until 9am. Children arriving later than 9am are late and need to be signed in by an adult. This is a legal requirement.

We are concerned at the number of children who arrive late daily. Many of our staff travel a considerable distance and are never late. We kindly ask you to consider these points and try to set off on your journey a few minutes earlier.

Holidays in Term Time
