#### Curriculum Update

Throughout the year, we will update you on our school curriculum in the weekly newsletter. This week, Mrs Brocklehurst, our Music Lead would like to tell you all about out music curriculum...

This half term in music at Mount Carmel, we are learning about pulse and rhythm. Each class is using body percussion and percussion instruments to explore the pulse of different pieces of music and to play and compose different rhythms. We are listening to a range of classical composers across the school, thinking about how the music makes us feel and which instruments we can hear. As always, we love singing at Mount Carmel and each class is learning a song in their music lessons.
