Message from the Headteacher

I am writing to you about my concerns regarding parking outside school at the start and at the end of the day. This year, the situation at our Infant Department has improved and I thank parents for their support with this. However, the parking situation at the Junior Department concerns me greatly. This week, staff have spoken with parents and carers who have stopped their car to drop off on the zig zag lines or in the middle of the road outside the Junior Department. Unfortunately, I feel this is becoming common place despite our pleas. I have received complaints from parents who are concerned about the situation and safety for all children. This behaviour is unsafe and this week I witnessed a near miss as a child got out of the car in the middle of the road. Please park up further down the road and walk your child to school. Please be aware that if you have a blue badge, you are still not permitted to park or drop off on the zig zag lines. Thanks to the parents and carers who keep our children safe and follow these rules.
