



In the Curriculum

Year 1 are reading the story 'Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis in their English lessons. This week the children have acted out the story by going to Bluebell Wood to find the creature in the pond. The children thought of super sentences to describe what happened to the Bog Baby in their writing lesson.

Year 3 have been botanists this week in science. They are investigating the conditions plants need to grow well. They planned and set up their experiment by planting seeds in different conditions. They will observe how well the seeds grow over the next couple of weeks.



Year 5 have been reading 'Cosmic' by Frank Cottrell Boyce in their English lessons. As part of their work on this text, the children have designed their own fairground ride and have been writing some amazing advertisements.

The children across school are enjoying their wellbeing sessions and their enrichment activities provided by Fifth Movement. This has been a great addition to our curriculum offer.



Over the last couple of weeks, the School Council have been organising a polling station in for school as part of the Make Your Mark campaign. This campaign, which is organised by UK Youth Parliament, aims to empower all children by giving them a say in the things that are important to them. The school council therefore organised an afternoon last Friday where all pupils in KS2 had the chance to vote on which topic is most important to them. The results from this have then been sent off to be collated as part of a national vote which will then inform the future work of the Youth Parliament. This was a great opportunity for the School Council to get to grips with how polling stations and ballots work and gave the KS2 children a flavour of what voting at a polling station is like. The children created posters, stood in front of classes to read out instructions, organised a register and set up the library for this event. It was a huge success and something we hope to build on in the future.



Easter Holiday Clubs

During 2024, Manchester Active and Manchester City Council are offering hundreds of FREE places for children eligible for benefit related free school meals to access a variety of activities over the school holiday periods. **Eligibility checks have changed for 2024 and the registration system will automatically recognise those who are eligible, with a booking code no longer being issued.**

Currently all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can get free school meals whatever your income. But, if you receive one of the qualifying incomes (see below) you will need to register for benefit related free school meals in order for the registration system to recognise that your child is eligible for a school holiday activity place. Your child may qualify for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- The guaranteed part of Pension Credit

- Child Tax Credit (if your annual gross income is £16,190 or less and you don't get Working Tax Credit)
- Working Tax Credit run-off after you come off Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit that you applied for on, or after, 1 April 2018. As long as your household income is less than £7,400 a year after tax, not including any benefits
- You may also qualify if you are an asylum seeker, or if a child receives any of these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian.
